FIRST SUNDAY OF THE MONTH SWISS BROADCAST IN NOVEMBER.

Unfortunately the reception of all European stations was so bad that we are not in a position to write a report on the programme. We are, however, hoping that the December Sunday Broadcast from Switzerland (December 2nd, 5.45 p.m.) will again be perfect. It was most surprising that while the monthly broadcast on wave lengths 20.64 and 26.31 could not be received at all, or towards the end, at least only unsatisfactorily, the daily broadcast from Switzerland on wave length 48.66 around the same time (5.45 p.m. to 6.40 p.m.) came in very well!
