The "banking secret" was discussed in the Grisons Grosser Rat during an examination of the existing practice of assessing and collecting taxes. On behalf of the government it was stated that the compulsory disclosure of private accounts or deposits would lower the confidence in the Kantonalbank and would generally endanger the finances of the canton.
