NEWS FROM SWITZERLAND

PRODUCTION OF CIGARETTES

In 1959, the production of cigarettes in Switzerland attained the figure of nine thousand eight hundred millions of cigarettes, as against nine thousand five hundred millions in 1958.

NEEDED ONLY TO BE THOUGHT OF

A Swiss manufacturer who specialises in garden umbrellas, has just produced a novelty which will be welcome by all those people who love to enjoy the fresh air in the garden, without being roasted by the sun. The invention in question is a large umbrella, which can be turned in all directions, gives complete protection, but does not possess the major inconvenience of having a pole which obstructs one's movements and is always getting in one's way. The "Pendalex," as it is called, is suspended from a bracket which can be moved and regulated, as desired. This new parasol, which is very easily managed, can thus provide shade for an ordinary table set for a meal.

SWISS COLONIES ABROAD

At the end of 1958, the Swiss colonies abroad consisted of the following: 160,291 Swiss citizens registered, who did not possess a dual nationality, and 95,317 citizens with a dual nationality.

CONFIRMATION OF SUCCESS ABROAD

After a first order for two incinerators for household garbage of a great capacity, which was given in 1957, the town of Hamburg has now given an order to the firm of L. de Roll, Ltd., of Zurich, for three additional furnaces for incinerating garbage.

After operations have been started in 1963, the plant which will contain five furnaces will be able to destroy more than 1000 tons of garbage per day.

SWISS ARE BIG MEAT-EATERS

Meat consumption per head of population has again increased in 1959, official statistics disclose. It now comes to 284,034 metric tons and corresponds to 118.6 lbs per head of the Swiss population.

DR. WANDER LTD. INCREASES CAPITAL

In order to provide sufficient means for the operation of the concern as well as for the financing of new buildings for the manufacture of their products, the share-holders' meeting of the firm of Dr. A. Wander Ltd., in Berne (which is particularly well-known for its "Ovaltine"), has just decided to increase the present capital of 9.5 million Swiss francs to 15 million francs, this increase being accomplished in two stages.

This increase in capital has been motivated by the development that has taken place in the commercial activity of the firm—thus requiring more floating capital as well as by the investments which have proved necessary for the enlargement of the research departments and manufacturing premises.
