I have been extremely pleased to read in the February issue of the "Helvetia", the kind welcome extended to my wife and myself, and wish to thank you for your thoughtfulness.

On my part, I would like to express to all of you, dear compatriots, my heartfelt greetings and, at the same time, say how very happy I am at having been sent to New Zealand.
