World Exhibition of Winter Sports

"Snow 75", the first World Exhibtiion of Skiing, Snow and Winter Sports, will be held in the premises of the Swiss Industries Fair in Basle from October 14th to 19th, 1975. It will be open to all industries connected with skiink, winter sports and tourism. Taking place only a few weeks before the start of the 1975-76 winter sports season, "Snow 75" will answer a wide variety of needs: apart from encouraging an active, healthy life through the practice of winter sports, it will enable professionals to exhibit and see the whole tremendous range of articles in this branch concentrated for the first time in the same exhibition area. Manufacturers, businessmen and the man in the street will have an opportunity of meeting the most competent representatives of all public, social or commercial organisations, associations and communities living for snow or dependent on snow for a livelihood. "Snow 75" is likely to become not only the biggest world exhibition of skiing, snow, winter sports and tourism but also an ideal meeting place favouring the promotion of ideas, contacts and exchanges among all those interested in the particular problems raised by these countless activities. The People's Republic of China has commissioned the Swiss firm of Sulzer Bros. Co. Ltd. (Winterthur, Zurich) and a French firm, the Electro-Mechanical Company (CEM), a branch if Brown Boveri & Co., to construct a big power station developing 300,000 kWh. The contract was signed in Peking by the representatives of the China National Import Corporation and a consortium formed by CEM, responsible for the technical and commercial side of the new power station, and Sulzer, the suppliers of the boiler. Since 1958, Swiss consumption of plastic has increased more than ten-fold, rising from 5.1 kg (11.2 lb.) per inhabitant to 57.3 kg (126 lb.) in 1973; the growth compared with 1972 is 14.4 per cent. It is estimated that 28 per cent of the 369,700 tons of plastic consumed—half of which is used in the packaging industry and the building trade—was produced by the Swiss chemical industry, the remainder being imported.
