Swissair Uses Larger DC9's and Phases Out Its CV-990 Convair Coronados

Swissair will by the end of this year deactivate its seven Convair 990 Coronado jets which of late have only been used on a limited scale as they became increasingly less economical. They will be replaced from next year by the newest DC-9-50 model seating 120 passengers. In July 1973, Swissair had been the first carrier to order ten DC-9-50s. As deliveries of these units will begin only by mid-1975, the ensuing capacity gap will in agreement with the manufacturer, McDonnell Douglas, be closed by Swissair leasing four DC-9 Series 41 from Scandinavian Airlines System (SAS) for periods of eight to twelve months. The first DC-9-41 now registered as HB-IDW and in Swissair colours has on October 9 been committed to line service. The other three DC-9-41s are to follow before the end of December. The DC-9-41s have a seating capacity for 107 passengers. They are thus somewhat larger than the 22 DC-9-32s that Swissair presently operates in a 92-seat configuration but smaller than the DC-9-50s Swissair has on order. All three versions carry 12 seats in first class.
