Swissair: Over 5 Million Passengers In 1974

In 1974, the ton-kilometers available on Swissair planes amounted to 1,757.8 million, which represents an increase of 6 per cent over the figure for 1973. Demand increased by 8 per cent to reach 939.4 million ton-kilometres. The mean load coefficient rose therefore from 53 to 54 per cent. Swissair carried 5,373,000 passengers, i.e. 6 per cent more than during the previous year. The transport of freight increased by 15 per cent and postal traffic by 3 per cent. Swissair flew 88,578 flights on its network of lines covering over 230,769 kilometres. The biggest rise in traffic was recorded in Africa, where demand was particularly encouraging with regard to both freight and passenger traffic. In the Near and Far Eastern sectors, the big increase in services was met by a considerable increase in demand; in the Near East, it was freight traffic, and in the Far East, passenger traffic that showed the biggest increases. The growth in traffic was smaller on the South Atlantic and European runs. In the North Atlantic sector, passenger traffic fell by 6 per cent. Freight and postal traffic, on the other hand, increased satisfactorily. (SODT)


