Europe's largest solar power station has just been put into operation at the Mont-Soleil, above St. Imier in the Jura. It is composed of 10560 solar panels spread over an area as large as 3 soccer fields and has cost over 8 million Swiss Francs. Used mainly for research and demonstration, the station has a capacity of 500KW, sufficient to supply power to 200 houses. The station was officially opened by the Federal Councillor Adolf Ogi.

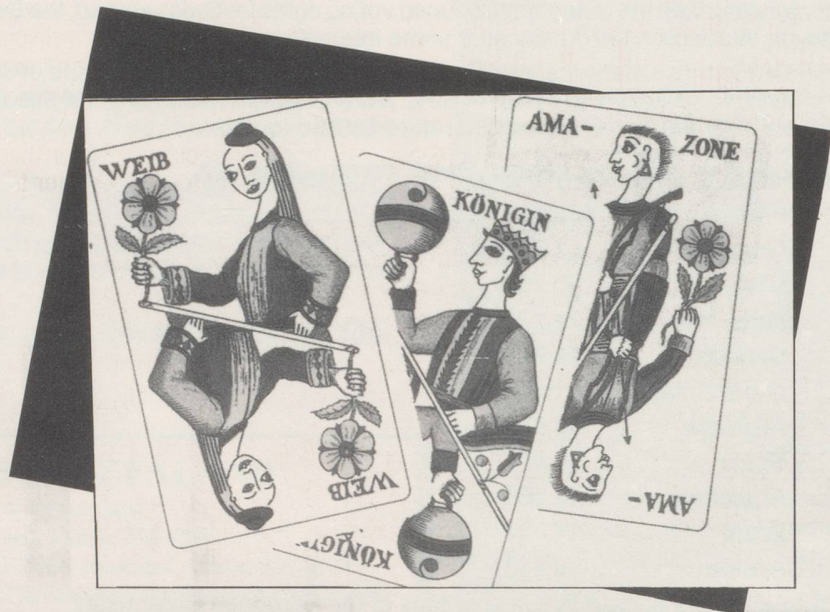

For all women who are looking for total equality in life, here they are: the playing cards specially made for them.

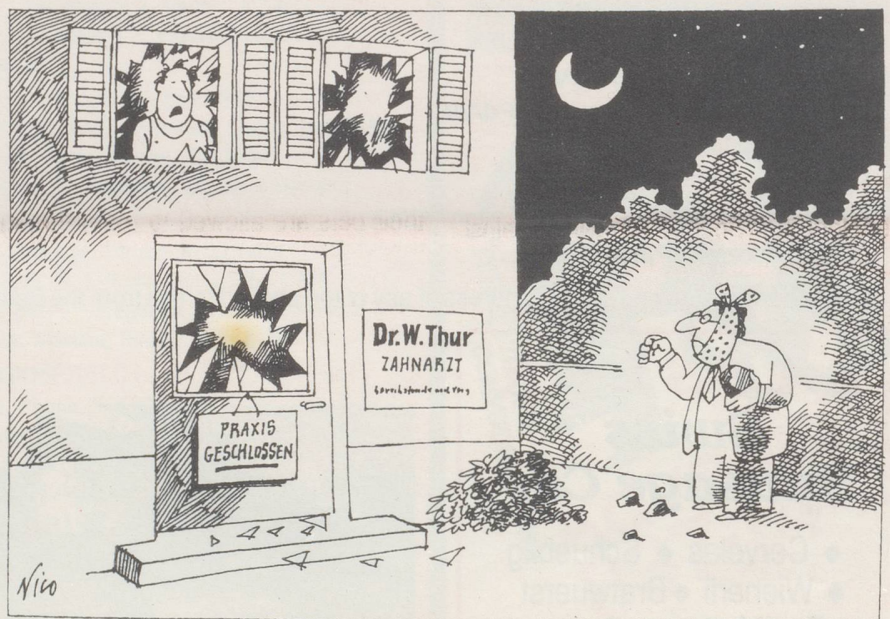
It was really unfair that up to now only men appeared on the (Swiss) - German playing cards. This injustice has now been rectified. Anyone game enough to play with these cards ??
