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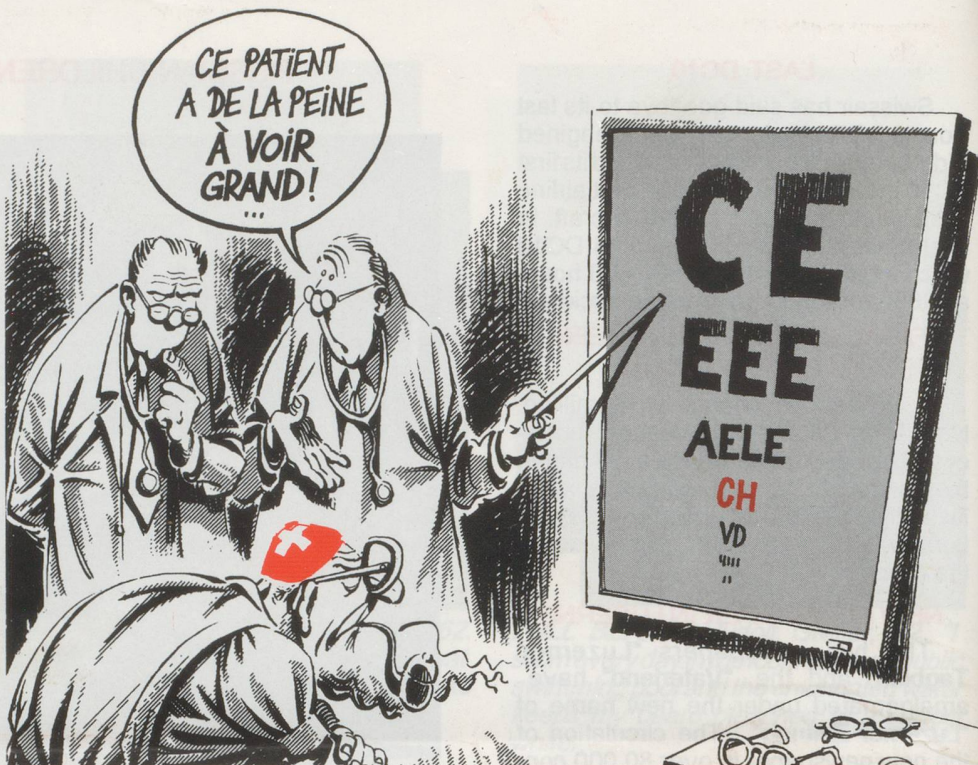
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NO TGV YET FOR ZÜRICH

Although Geneva and Basel are already connected to the French Railway's TGV network (Trains à Grande Vitesse), the world's fastest trains, Zürich, according to a representative of the SNCF (French Railways), will have to wait for a long time yet until it will see the first regular TGV service because the SNCF has more urgent priorities on its own territory, one of the most important being a new loop-line around Paris.

MARTIGNY, FIRST BISHOP SEAT IN SWITZERLAND?

The first bishop seat in Switzerland existed most likely in Martigny (Wallis) according to the results of some excavations undertaken underneath Martigny's main church. The remains of a church dating back to the 4th century indicate that Christianity was already present in Wallis at that time and that Martigny, together with Sitten and St Maurice, was a key position for the early Christian faith.
