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ZURICH-HAMBURG IN 7 HOURS

Zurich is now connected to the German Highspeed Train network operating at 280 Km per hour. The comfortable silver Superexpress called "PANDA" of the German Bundesbahn operates daily from Zurich via Basle to Frankfurt and Hamburg and vice-versa. Travelling time to Frankfurt is now less than 4 hours. With the continued re-alignment of the rail tracks to allow higher and higher speeds, trains are rapidly becoming the preferred mode of transport in Europe. They are more comfortable than cars and faster than planes for distances of up to 500 Km. Pricewise they are also much more economical than air travel.
