

HIGHEST PAID SWISS ?

Strangely enough, one Swiss who enjoys one of the highest salaries by anyone's standard feels that he is the lowest paid man in his field. Furthermore, he does not even live in Switzerland.

The man in question is Chrysler-Boss **Bob LUTZ**. President of the Chrysler Motor Corporation of America, Robert A. Lutz (60) draws a yearly salary of just under 1 million SFR. But Lutz estimates that he is one of the lowest paid managers in the car makers industry. Lutz, who's trademarks are his expensive cigars and his Breitling wrist watch, is a battler. He was born in Zurich and his first visit to the USA was at the age of 7. Bachelor of Science in 1961, Lutz holds a double nationality. He joined the US Navy as a jet fighter pilot and flies his own helicopter. He became Sales Manager with Opel in 1970, then moved over to Ford in 1974. He joined Chrysler in 1986 as a Director and became President of that company in 1988.

Thanks to financial support from commercial firms, the engineering school of Biel has decided to build a new "Spirit of Biel-Bienne III" at a cost of some 3 million SFR. The team from Biel won 3rd place in the Darwin to Adelaide race in 1987 and became the undisputed winner in 1990.

SWISS ARMY SHRINKING

As part of the move to convert the Swiss Army from "Armee 61" to "Armee 95", the Military Department intends to reduce the Swiss Army by 200.000 men, in other words from 600.000 to 400.000.

As a result, the various classes of "Auszug, Landwehr & Landsturm" will be disbanded and the total time a Swiss has to serve in the army will be reduced by 8 years. These measures have been largely dictated by financial considerations.
