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EDITORIAL

RESULTS OF QUESTIONNAIRE concerning the Helvetia Magazine (see April issue page 3). In total 22 families sent in their views on the subject. This represents around 5% of the total number of subscribers. Whether a clear picture can be obtained from such a small percentage is debatable, but it is all we have to go by, so here are the results based on these replies: 85% of the readers are happy with the magazine, 15% are reasonably happy. A comforting thought for your Editor is that no one said they hated it. As to the frequency of issue, 44% would like to see more than 8 issues a year (11 or 12 a year), 22% would like the number reduced to 6 issues per year and 34% are happy with the present 8 issues. Concerning the size of the magazine, 79% favour the present size, 11% have no opinion and 10% would like a return to the previous format (half the size of the present magazine). The question of magazine versus newsletter received a

As they are already subsidising a good cause in the form of "Erst August Abzeichen", why not a support to the Society? - Do away with all present meaningless articles and concentrate on more in-depth and cultural articles (a tall order for your Editor who has to work for his living and does the magazine free of charge during his spare time.
