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
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UNUSUAL COMMUTERS

Researchers, working at the "Eidgenössisches Institut für Schnee und Lawinenforschung" on top of the Weissfluhjoch at 2660 m overlooking the Parsenn skiing area way above Davos, use some of the most unusual ways to get to and from work, particularly in the off-season, when the Parsenn mountain railway does not operate right up to the Weissfluhjoch. Travel to work can include bicycling to the Parsenn railway station in the valley, take the railway as far up the mountain as it will go and then travel the rest of the way by snowmobile. Some of the researchers prefer to jog all the way up from Davos to the Weissfluhjoch, a difference of 1100 m in altitude, a feat which takes them around 70 minutes if they are very fit.

Others again choose to travel to and from the Weissfluhjoch by mountain bike, unless of course the snow is too deep.

But it is for the return journey home that some researchers reach out for the most unusual form of travel. In winter, some of them will simply use their skis or a snowboard to return to Davos, but the more adventurous ones use hang-gliders and para-gliders. Under good weather conditions it takes them only a

few minutes from the time they jump off the Weissfluhjoch until they land right in the back yard of their own houses down in the valley. To have dinner ready when Dad comes home, Mum only has to look out the window. When she sees Dad jumping off the Weissfluhjoch, strapped to his hang-glider, she will know that he will be home within the next few minutes. That's what you call "dropping-in for a meal"....




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A researcher ready to jump off the Weissfluhjoch to return home to his family at the end of his shift, a most unusual way indeed to commute to and from work.
