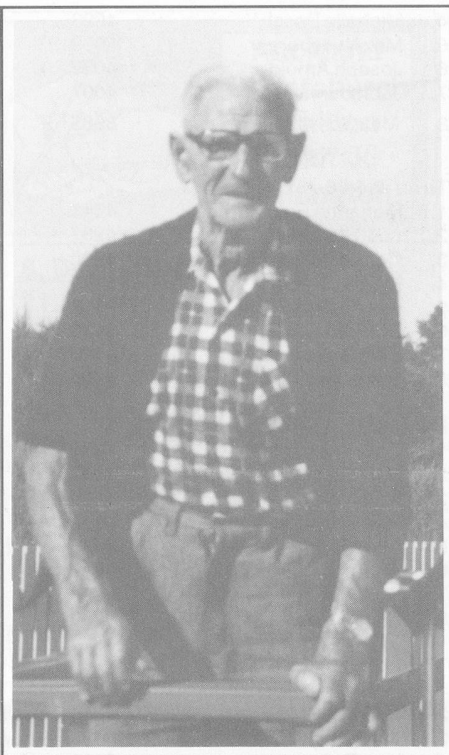
In conclusion with my report for this year's shooting season, I would like to congratulate all the winners and wish all the other participants better luck next year.

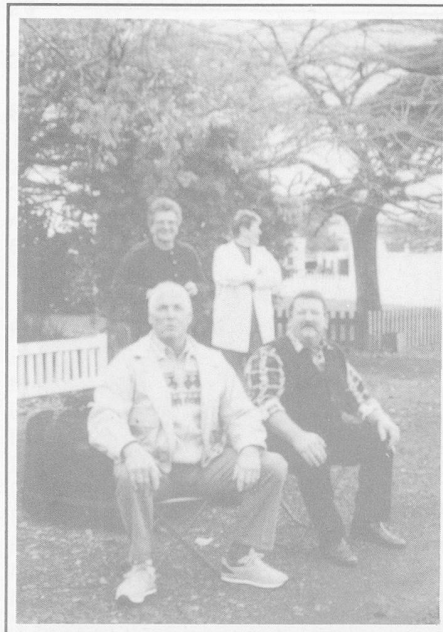
