




OVERALL STATISTICS

Medal allocation is calculated by taking the highest scoring 20% of participants in each sport, for each Club.

The actual percentage can vary slightly due to both the number of participants as well as the number of equal scores of the lowest medal winning placings, in each sport. In all cases, calculation and allocation are rounded up.

The number of medals awarded, compared to the number of medal placings, differs because several competitors have won a medal in more than one sports event, and this is denoted by a star on the medal presented.
