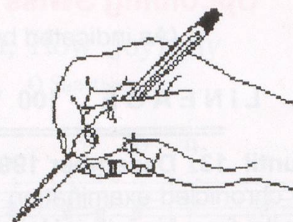

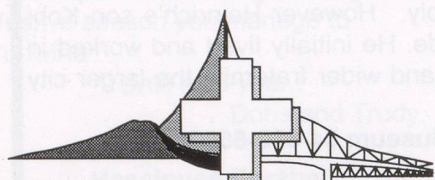

This group thoroughly appreciated their time with us and maybe some of us will catch up with them in Switzerland some time.

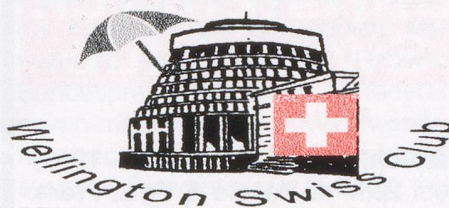

Shotput was measured with his usual professional precision by Roland Schütz. Best results:

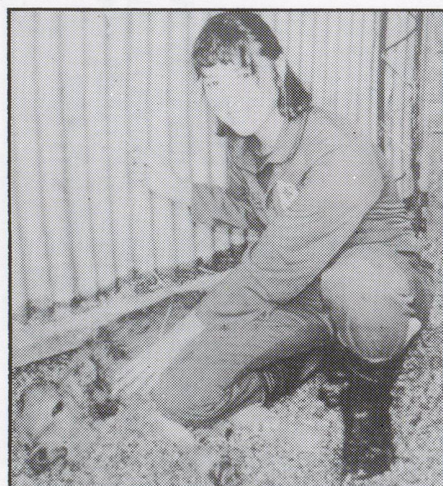
Murray Hughes, Hans Glauser, Roland Schütz; best women was Edit Burla.
