**Do you know the name of this historic Swiss town?**

This, the Capital of Canton Uri is a town of 8500 inhabitants at the foot of the northern slopes of the Gotthard massif. The monument of the legendary Hero William Tell with his Son is the hallmark of the town and was created in 1895 by the artist Richard Kissling. 200 years ago in 1799 the town in question suffered a major fire with near total destruction. In this town the 'William-Tell-theatrical society was founded in 1898. Friedrich Schiller's production of "William Tell" is performed here at regular intervals by a troupe of lay actors.
