Situated on the river Aare between Olten and Biel, near the Jura mountains, this small yet fascinating Swiss town is the Capital of the Canton bearing the same name. A bilingual town on the German-French language border, it boasts a Clock Tower, the oldest building in town. You will even find a 'Crooked Tower' or "Krummturm", the oldest fortification in town. The surrounding countryside offers numerous possibilities for sport and leisure like Golf, Swimming (an open-air pool next to the Aare), Curling or hiking up Mount Weissenstein (1284 m). A trip on the River Aare from here to Biel (Biel), with a stop at Altretu to see the stork reserve (with 200 semi wild storks), is one of the finest river excursions in Switzerland. - Alternately you could visit St. Verena Hermitage north of the town with its resident Hermit.
