Another Swiss Specialty

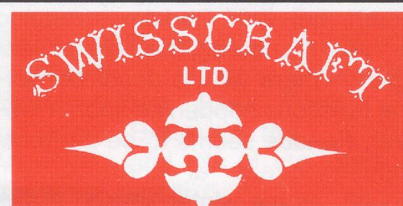
Croûtes au Fromage

(from the Romandie - French speaking part of Switzerland)

- put 8 big slices of white bread on an oven tray and grill both sides
- drizzle 50-100ml white wine over the bread slices
- combine 400gr grated cheese and 2 tablespoons flour
- mix together 2 eggs, 150ml white wine, and freshly grated pepper.
Combine this together with the cheese mixture and spread evenly on each slice of grilled bread.
Bake for 10 minutes at 250°C on bottom grill in oven.
Serve hot with salad, and enjoy a beer or glass of white wine with it.

Tips - use toasted bread

- instead of baking croûtons, put under grill - check frequently.
