


Do you know the name of this Swiss holiday destination ?

Situated in the heart of Switzerland, this town is at the foot of the 'Rigi' mountain. It can be reached by rail and is the fourth station on the line from Luzern to Arth Goldau. The lakes of Lucerne and Zug are nearby and the famous 'Hohle Gasse' meaning the 'Sunken Lane' is part of the connection between the two lakes. It was here that folk hero William Tell is said to have killed Gessler, the local bailiff, with a shot from his cross bow. On the edge of the town the traveler can find the famous Queen Astrid Chapel. It was erected in memory of Astrid, Queen of Belgium, killed on that spot in a road accident in 1935. The name of the town is composed of 2 words and also depicts the locality, ".....am Rigi" meaning near the Rigi mountain.
