


#### Swiss president opens new embassy in Berlin

## Chocosuisse calls for members' solidarity

The umbrella organisation of the chocolate industry in Switzerland, Chocosuisse, has celebrated its 100th birthday with a call for solidarity among its members. The Swiss economics minister, Pascal Couchepin, took part in an official celebration in Bern to mark the centenary.

#### Swiss Vege Car

A Swiss manufacturer has developed a sports car that runs on rotting vegetables and can accelerate from zero to 100 kilometres per hour in under six seconds. The car runs on gas given off by fermenting organic household waste, as one of its fuel supplies. Tests have shown that 100 kilograms of smelly rubbish will power the car for 100 km.

the car known as the Advantigo R, has been developed by a Swiss manufacturer and is being displayed at motor shows around the world. The car runs on two sources of power. As well as conventional petrol, it uses kompagas, a renewable fuel source made from rotting greenery. However, the car is not yet ready for mass production. There is only one in the world and it comes with a half-a-million-pound price tag.

## Swiss Cabinet unveils new treaties



#### Swiss Government measure to raise contributions of selfemployed rejected

The Swiss parliament has rejected a government proposal to increase the mandatory contributions of the selfemployed to the state pension scheme. The government wanted to bring the contributions up to 8.1 per cent of income, against the current rate of 7.8 per cent.

Swiss Post issued a chocolatescented stamp in May to mark the 100th anniversary of Chocosuisse, the Association of Swiss Chocolate Manufacturers.
