**Do you know the name of this Swiss holiday destination?**

The photo shows the center (with mediaeval character) of the town situated between the Jura and the lake that bears its name. This town with its 52,000 inhabitants is a dual-language town and its name is familiar in French as well as in German. It represents the heart of the Swiss watch making industry and together with its neighbouring town of Grenchen lays claim to the invention of the world famous 'Swatch'-watch. This town is an important junction on the net of the Swiss Federal Railway-system. It is approx. half way from Solothurn to Neuchatel or can be reached from Bern as easily as from Basel via Délemont. Tourists may visit the "Omega'-Museum here, or they might be interested in the nearby suburb of Magglingen with the Swiss Sports School. This town will be the center of the Swiss National Exhibition in 2002.
