

300 Meter Shooting Competition

The Auckland Swiss Club has its own shooting section situated at their Kaukapakapa Clubhouse, and Hamilton shooters are invited to be a part off this section at no cost. A great thank you to the Aucklanders for having us up there year after year.

The Auckland Shooting Section (of which we Hamilton shooters are also a part) has achieved outstanding placings in the international Swiss shooting circle. We seem to be in the top four, behind clubs such as Johannesburg, Vancouver and our friends in Kaponga.

Each year, a small group from Hamilton travels northward to take part in this event. We normally shoot four programs - Obligatorisch, Feldschiessen, Auslandschweizer- and Einzelwettschiessen.

I have been a part of this event for only a few years so far, and I enjoy this day of cameraderie and competition every time. Sadly, I see some good colleagues no longer attending due to such things as failing eyesight, so we also continuously need new participants. The competition is open to all Swiss citizens and their families - young and old, ladies and gents.

Earlier this month (Sept.), four Club members went to the Auckland Schützenball and I was proud to represent the Hamilton shooters as I collected all the medals that made it to the Waikato. Congratulations to all the shooters, and especially Robert Frischknecht for winning the Hamilton Trophy and the silver medal for second place overall with 323 points. He was beaten only by Auckland's Henry Werffeli. Wayne Hodel won the overall Junior Trophy, and many other individual medals also made it down to the Waikato.

The Hamilton Swiss Club has always supported the event by paying transport (petrol) costs for everyone to travel to Kaukapakapa. Now, the Club is offering further support in an effort to encourage more people to participate in this shooting event.

All junior shooters, up to the age of 20, and all new adult shooters, or those who haven't shot for 10 or more years, will be entitled to shoot the obligatorisch program free of charge - the cost of one program is currently \$15.

Next year's shooting event will be held at the Auckland Swiss Club Farm, Kaukapakapa, on 19th May 2002. Remember, no shooting experience is required and tuition is available.

I would like to thank the Hamilton Swiss Club for their support, and hope we will see some new faces next year.
