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
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# HELVETIA



## Do you know the name of this much loved Swiss mountain?

This mountain is the most domineering feature on the shores of lake Lucerne. Although belonging to the canton of Obwalden, it can easily be reached either from Lucerne itself by steamer, with destination of Alpnachstad, or by train on the Brünig-Interlaken line. Records show that this much loved mountain was first scaled in 1750. Today tourists can reach the summit in comfort riding Europe's steepest cog-railway from Alpnachstad to the summit at 2080 meters. The name of this mountain is the same as the name of the Roman procurator of Judea who authorised the crucifixion of Jesus as written in the Bible. According to a legend first recorded in the 15th century, the soul of the Roman procurator was spewed from the river Tiber into the river Rhone and then into a mountain lake on the mountain in question, where it is languishing to this day.
