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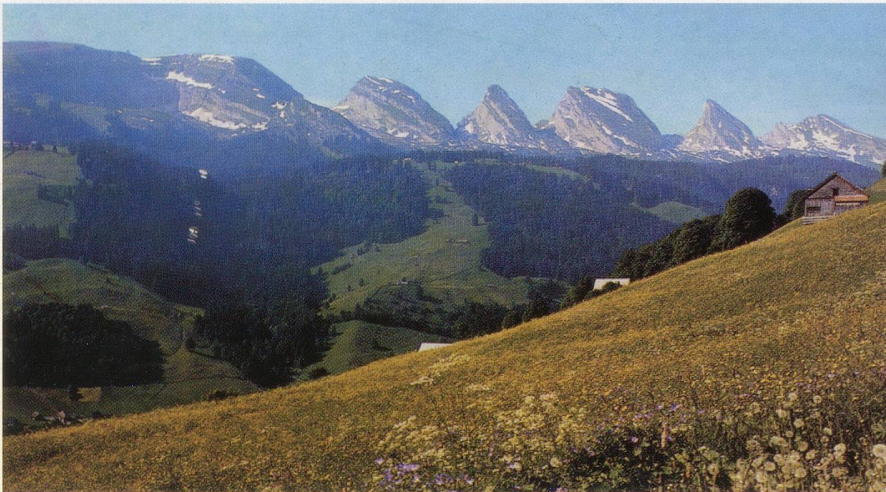
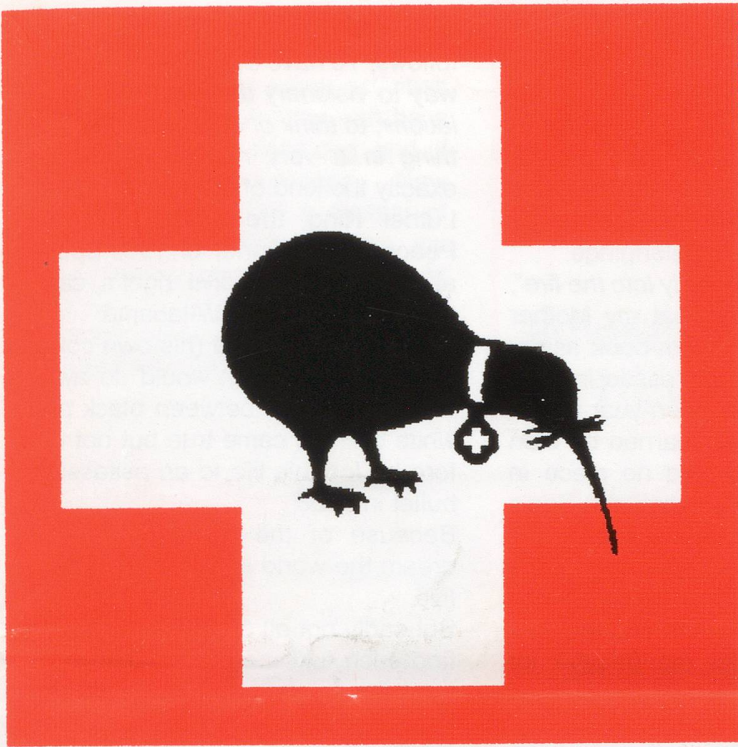

Do you know the name of this "chain of Swiss mountains"  
in Eastern Switzerland ?

These seven mountains of an average height of 2200 meters are the most prominent landmark at the upper end of the valley of Toggenburg in Canton St. Gallen, Eastern Switzerland. The gentle gradient of most of these mountains is a ready invitation for many tourists of good walking or climbing constitution. Especially the 'Selun' (the seventh of this "chain of mountains") lends itself for easy access across mountain meadows all the way to the summit. 'Chäserrugg-mountain' (the second of this "chain of mountains") can be "conquered" in two stages, by funicular railway from Alt St.Johann to Itios, and then by cable-car to the summit where a restaurant awaits the 'lazy mountaineer'. On reaching the top of one of these mountains there is the reward of a stunning view of lake 'Walensee', or down the valley of Obertoggenburg, Wildhaus, Nesslau, Wattwil.
