Obituary

Max Wilfried Bachmann 1921 - 2002

Max grew up in Rüti, Kanton of Zurich, where he became a butcher and worked for Bell as store manager. He emigrated to New Zealand in 1951 with his wife Elisabeth from Madiswil, BE, and first two daughters, Verena and Elisabeth, and soon offered his sausage making skills to the new homeland with contributions to Vienna Foods and in his own shop in Blockhouse Bay. The couple had three more daughters, Suzanne, Christine and Greta. His dedication to the Swiss immigrants to New Zealand made him a founding member of the Auckland Swiss Club and he played a pivotal part in the purchase of the club's land at Kaukapakapa in 1965.

He was a dedicated father of 5 daughters and grandfather to numerous grandchildren. To his family we extend our deepest sympathy. His spirit that is love and humour will always fuel the

activities of our club.

Unemployment Figures

The national unemployment rate at the end of September stood at 2.8%, the highest figure in 3.5 years. But still better than most other European countries. The highest individual cantons were Geneva with 5.6%, Jura with 3.8 % and Zurich with 3.4%. These figures are not expected to improve before the middle of 2003.

The Federal Council wishes to raise the tax on a packet of cigarettes by 30 cents, which would raise the price from the present Fr 4.80 to Fr 5.10.

However, because of federal tax laws it cannot. The council could raise the tobacco tax on a packet by only 10 cents per year.

So the council appealed to the full parliament to change the tobacco tax laws to grant it a more liberal hand on this.

On September 24, after some debating, the National Council granted the Federal Council's request and passed the new laws by a substantial majority.

Family Walk

Quite coincidentally, on the Friday evening before our planned family walk, the Te Waihou Walkway, near Putaruru, appeared on Maggie's Garden Show, so those who caught it could see in advance what a great walkway it is. As well, it conveniently served as a reminder to a few people to check the date again.

But for a lot of the past week, and then for most of Saturday as well, it just continued to pour down, casting a rather damp cloud over the prospects of good weather for our walk on Sunday. As with the Pirongia walk last April, it looked like it would become another wet and soggy trek.

This is the spot where 60% of New Zealand's bottled water is collected from. The water at this part of the river is very still and crystal clear.

The walkway itself is all on private farmland along the Waihou River. The track contains some boardwalks, and there are several well-built styles for crossing fences. The riverbanks contain a lot of new and diverse plantings, including many natives - used as a filter to protect the river from erosion.

As most people set off on the walk, a few of us then drove down to the other end of the track and walked the approx 500m to the meeting point from there.

Our group of about 25 people was made up of all ages - from under five to over 70.

By midday, we all came together again and sitting on the riverbank, we enjoyed our picnic lunch, good company and sunshine.

A little later, most started on the return journey down river again. A few people, who only wanted to do the walk one way, walked the shorter distance back to the end of the track for a ride back to the Whites Road car park, where we finally all met up again.

In planning this event, we thought it would be an idea to go to a café afterwards; perhaps in Tirau. But Agnes Gaemperle then invited everyone back to her place for coffee and home made Apfelstrudel - an offer we couldn't possibly refuse!

Many sat inside around the large dining table, while others made the most of the sun outside. Thank you, Agnes, for your hospitality. This was a really lovely way to end what turned out to be a very enjoyable day - and as planned, a family day, with many children, and even grandchildren, taking part.
