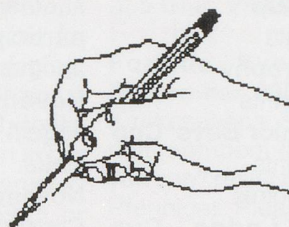

News from Switzerland

Roger Federer in the record books.

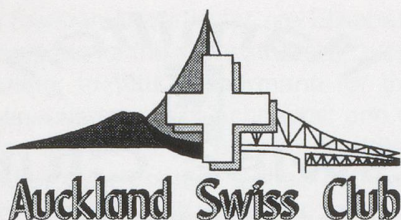

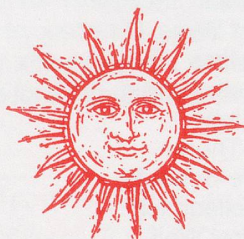

Forthcoming Events...

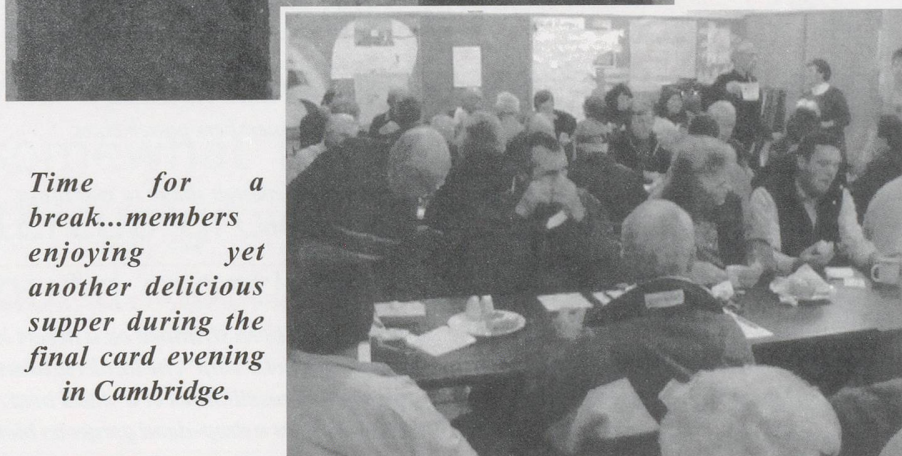

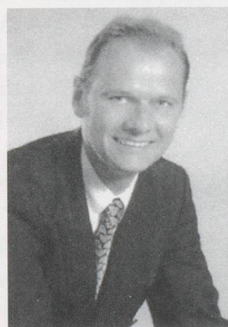
