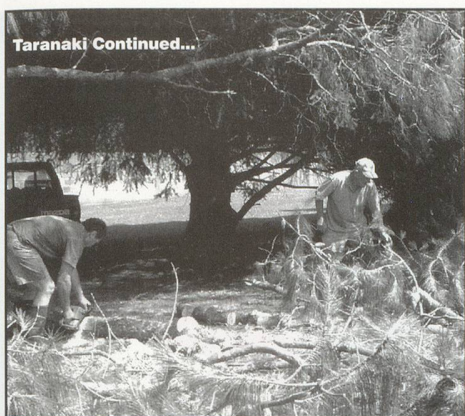

18 Championship / Society Shoot will be held from 1.00pm. Please support Mark in the smallbore section of the shooting club.

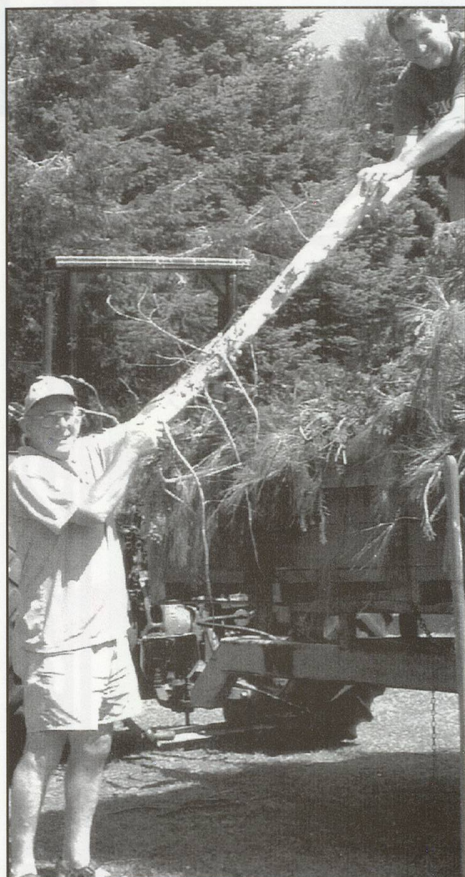

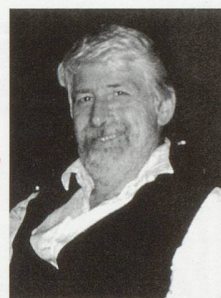
Obituary
