If I had any chores, they had to be done.

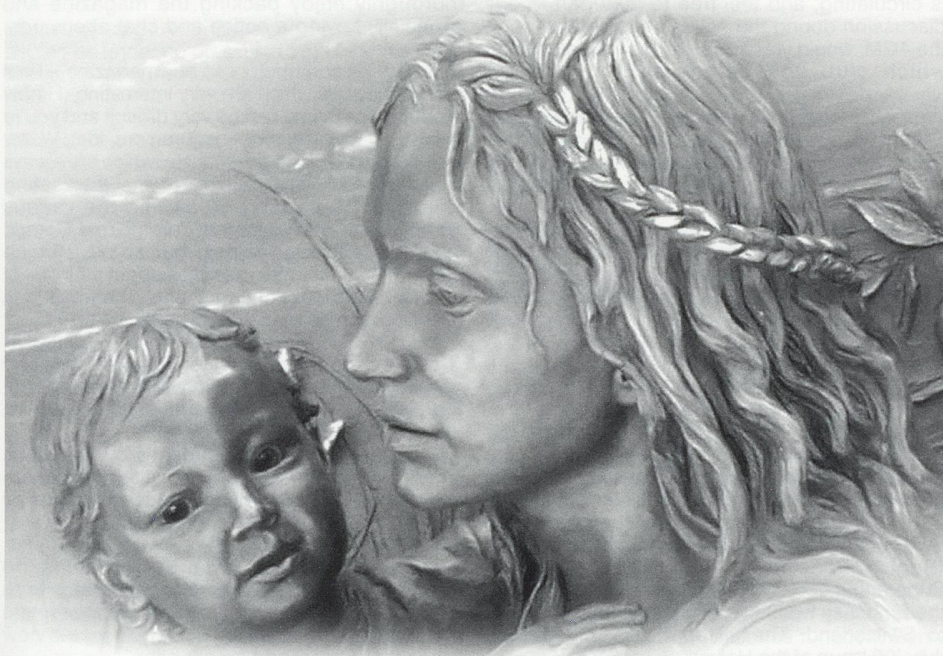
My whereabouts she wanted to know;
