Chnoepfli, Fondue, Raclette, Omelette Neuchateloise.

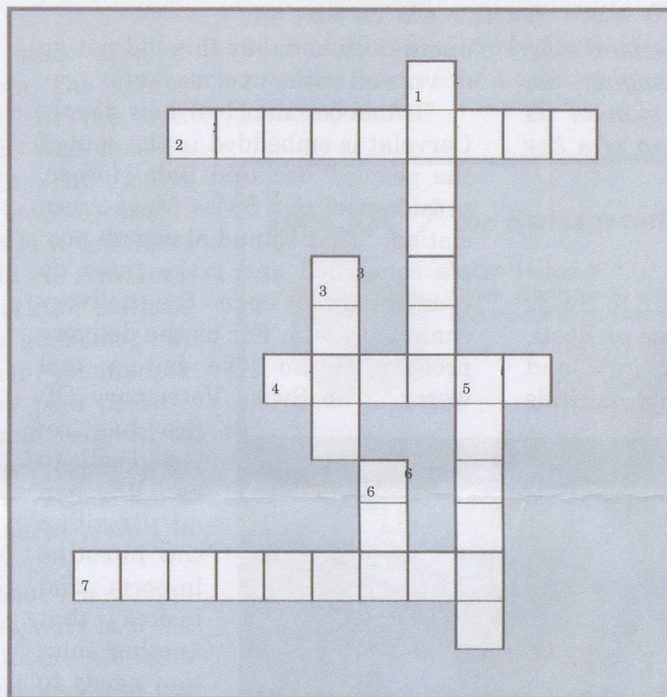
What do you like about Switzerland?

DID YOU KNOW?

The kangaroo can jump four times its own length. But the animal long-jump champion is the **flea**: It can leap 100 times its own length.



How can you tell a seal from a sea lion? There are two main differences between a seal and a sea lion. A sea lion has ears, and a seal



has no visible ears. In addition, a sea lion can move on land by using all of its four flippers, but a seal can only drag itself forward with its two front flippers



The **coco de mer** palm of the Seychelles Islands has the biggest seed. Each nut weighs up to 18 kilograms.

The **Goliath spider** of Guyana is the world's biggest spider. It can measure up to 270mm across and hunts birds and lizards.



What is the difference between a **frog** and a **toad**?



You can tell a frog from a toad by its skin. In general, a frog has a moist, smooth, shiny skin. The skin of a toad is dry, dull and rough or covered with warts. Also, frogs are usually good at jumping and toads are not.



The biggest snake is the South American **anaconda**. It can grow eight metres long and weigh 200 kilograms.
