### The 87th Auslandschweizerkongress in Lucerne, 7-9 August 2009 Report from Othmar Hebler

Marlies and I went to Switzerland for a holiday for the whole month of August, and as the ASO (Auslandschweizerorganisation) Congress was in Lucerne, I took part as the representative for New Zealand.

Since almost half (45%) of the delegates were new to the ASO, a function was organized to get to know each other. On Friday 7th the Assembly started at 9am at the City Council Chambers for the 140 delegates from 110 different states. With so many new delegates the average age dropped from 70+ to 56 years of age, with 30% women. There were different themes on discussion: Swiss Schools Abroad, business clubs, swissreview, the closure of Swiss abroad bank accounts, solifund, budget cuts in general and the possible closure of embassies.

The Bund would like to close the embassies in the countries around Switzerland since there is an open travel policy; you no longer have to stop for customs going from Switzerland to any neighbouring country. The idea is that Swiss clubs function more as business clubs, and Honorary Consuls to take the place of Embassies. Swiss business clubs generally invite people from industries and governments and then foster business relationships and help to settle deals. Here in N.Z. the Swiss clubs have a different function; they are social clubs.

UBS and other Swiss banks have started, mainly in America and Italy, to freeze the bank accounts of Swiss abroad that failed to have any transactions for more than 3 months. The general manager of Postbank is looking at maybe taking this on board, too.

The Swiss government wants to shave about Sfr 500'000 off from the swissreview. You could help save by only having 1 magazine per family or try and get it online www.revue.ch

Swiss Schools Abroad (Auslandschweizerschulen) are under scrutiny for funding, too.

On Saturday everybody went to the Verkehrshaus, where various speakers presented their views on Swiss tourism and Swiss postal services; parliamentarians gave an outlook on the political situation, followed by a question and answer session and of course wonderful food and a choice of different Swiss entertainment. Sunday was the farewell day, with either a trip to the Rigi or a tour around the old city of Lucerne.

This was a very interesting experience, and most important of all I got to know Swiss delegates from all over the world.

### Morton Frederic Walter Rogers 12.10.1919 - 28.05.2009

Fred (as he was known to us) was the third child of Paulina (Pollie) and Tim Rogers. Pollie was born in Baar, Switzerland and married Tim in the Sacred Heart Church in Manaia, South Taranaki, on 27<sup>th</sup> July 1915.

Primary schooling started for Fred when he was 7 years old at St Pats Convent School in Kaponga and Kapuni School. He then thoroughly enjoyed two years at St Pats College Silverstream (Upper Hutt) from 1933 to 1934. His working life was spent farming then factory work until he was manpowered back to the farm when war broke out in 1939. In the late 1940s he worked for Arthur Brown Constructions Co helping build the huge chimney for the present day Lactose factory in Kapuni.

In June 1954, in Palmerston North, he married Barbara and they raised a family of seven – Sylvia, Brian, Fred (jnr), Eileen, Len, Carmen and Paul. He was very, very proud of their children, 19 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren. After working for Arthur Brown he returned to farming until he retired in May 1989.

In earlier years he thoroughly enjoyed the Swiss picnics, 1<sup>st</sup> August celebrations and the bus trips to the Auckland, Hamilton and Wellington Swiss Clubs for the Cowbell Competitions.

The Sacred Heart Church Manaia was packed for Fred's funeral and he was laid to rest at the Manaia Lawn Cemetery South Taranaki on the 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2009 with a Guard of Honour by the Swiss Club. Zeno played the accordion and Othmar played the Alphorn at the graveside.
