I love animals. Some people even tease me about my relationship to my cat; but she really is the loveliest, friendliest cat you can imagine, purring and snuggling up to anyone if she gets half a chance.

So I love blackbirds, but not slugs? Cauliflowers from the supermarket, without slugs and caterpillars, suddenly seemed attractive; isn't it tempting to eliminate fundamental questions? However, life is complicated, and I like it rich - even if this means slugs in the cauliflower.
