Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Swiss Society of New Zealand Inc., held at the Matangi Hall in Hamilton, hosted by the Hamilton Swiss Club, on 31st May 2009

Meeting opened: 1.30pm

1. Welcome

Roland Schütz, the Society President, welcomes everyone to the AGM of the Swiss Society of New Zealand, with a special welcome to the Ambassador of Switzerland, Dr. Beat Nobs. It is always a pleasure to meet fellow Swiss from the other Swiss clubs.

He asks all Society members to sign the attendance book circulating, and to take part in any discussion during the AGM; tell us your name and the Swiss club you belong to - and please speak loud.

2. Apologies

5. Minutes

7. President's Report

Roland Schütz acknowledges Heidi Amelung's and Trudi Brühlmann's work on the Helvetia. Then he reminds us that the Swiss Society originated with the purpose to help Swiss compatriots in need. He would like all to know that this purpose still exists.

Marcel Rüedi moves that the president's report be accepted; Rinaldo Rust seconds it.

8. Editor's Report

Trudi Brühlmann thanks everybody who made the team's efforts easier and praises Heidi Amelung for her outstanding work and computer skills with the layout and the pictures. Rinaldo Rust moves that the report be accepted, and Marcel Rüedi seconds it.

9. Treasurer's Report

Heidi Amelung explains the figures on the balance sheet. The Society had a good year.

Hans Iten moves that the treasurer's report be accepted, and Marcel Rüedi seconds it.

10. Delegate for the Swiss Abroad's Report

Heinz Leuenberger reads his last report as the delegate to the Swiss Abroad. He has resigned after holding this office for 13 years. Heinz Leuenberger moves that his report be accepted, and Lina Rufer seconds it. The Ambassador thanks Heinz Leuenberger for his services.

11. Riflemaster's Report

Mark Kiser reports that the participation in the Cowbell Competition is fairly stable. As soon as he has all the results from all the clubs he will order the medals; they should be at the clubs ready to be handed out on 1st August. Mark Kiser moves that his report be accepted, and Trudi Fill seconds it.

12. Setting of Subscriptions 2009/2010

It is recommended that subscriptions remain the same for next year. Roland Schütz moves this recommendation, and Mathias Seifert seconds it.

13. Election of Officers

All office holders are re-elected: Roland Schütz, president, Max Fuhrer, vice president, Heidi Amelung, treasurer, Trudi Brühlmann, secretary and editor, Mark Kiser, riflemaster, Lyn Hansen, auditor - moved by Marianne Drummond, seconded by Rinaldo Rust.

14. Election of the Delegate and the Deputy Delegate for the Swiss Abroad

Heinz Leuenberger proposes Othmar Hebler as Delegate, and Marianne Drummond seconds it. Ro-

land Schütz proposes Emanuel Züst as Deputy Delegate, and Marcel Rüedi seconds it. The Ambassador congratulates Othmar to the election and stresses the importance of being represented in the Organisation of the Swiss Abroad.

15. General Business

Rinaldo Rust says it is possible to watch Swiss television and listen to Swiss radio programs via computer. Ways to do so should be published in the *Helvetia*.

Rinaldo Rust also suggests that young people might feel more attracted if the Swiss Society changed its name to Swiss Cultural Society. Maybe the clubs should introduce 'silent membership' (*Passivmitgliedschaft*). More modern Swiss music is suggested, and activities on Sundays rather than Saturdays, as Saturdays are taken up with sports. Marcel Rüedi says Auckland has tried to find new, young members, but the result is not overwhelming.

Club reports

Auckland: Auckland president Marcel Rüedi reports that the membership drive has brought the club some new members, and other new members have joined, too. The club is in good shape, with varied activities in addition to the traditional ones.

Hamilton: Hans Vetsch reports for Herbert Stäheli, who is ill. The Hamilton Swiss club had a good year. The Fondue and the picnic are especially popular. Shooting and Jassen go well, too. He thanks the Auckland club for letting Hamilton use their shooting range.

Taranaki: Taranaki president Othmar Hebler thanks for being trusted with the OSA Delegate office. He has delegated the yearly report to Marianne Drummond. Marianne Drummond acknowledges the efforts made by the committee to ensure functions are well-organized and successful. They have a good committee and a very committed president and have several new members. Taranaki has a new patron, Sepp Kiser.

Wellington: Wellington president Roland Schütz reports that the Wellington club has many young members; they are snowballing, but it takes a while to get the ball rolling and growing. Children are free at the functions; there is a mothers' group who meet informally; it is like small clubs within the big club. The club has got the building permit for the new roof and an extension, which would give more room for the children, too.
