Friday, 6th May - First Card Evening and Medal Jass. Please be prompt to start at 7.30pm.

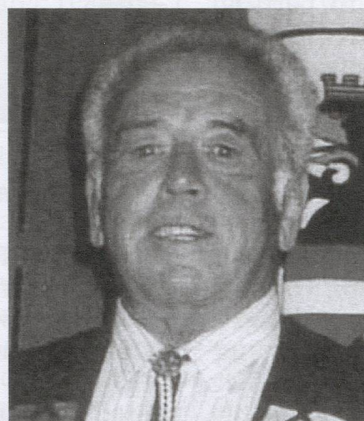

Otto Tiefenbacher

18th February 1931 - 26th January 2011

Otto was born in Obbenberg, Austria, as one of four children. After finishing an apprenticeship as a bricklayer Otto left Austria for New Zealand, arriving in Titahi Bay in 1953.

Otto worked as a bricklayer for two years before he changed careers to work in the hospitality industry. He began as a waiter in Casa Fontana but it was not long before he opened his own restaurant in the Overseas Terminal called "Ottos Hafen".

He later ran several successful ventures, including the Marshal Lounge in the Winter Show Building, The Majestic Cabaret, Café Mozart in the Michael Fowler Centre, and Square Affair in the Town Hall.

Otto was an active member of the Wellington Swiss Club. He was also president of the Austrian Society for which he received the Silver Medal of Merit from Austria. He later received the Gold Medal of Merit for his service to Austria as their Consul in Wellington for over 20 years.
