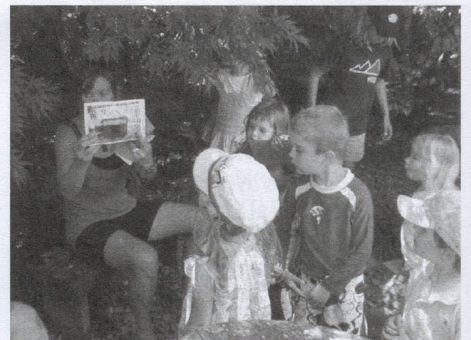

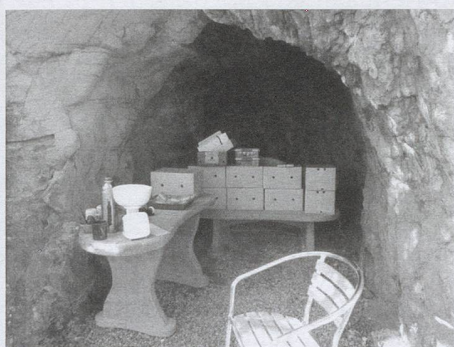

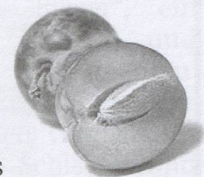

Fellenberg-Zwetschgen, Swiss Plums



It is late summer, and it's time for plums. We are blessed with Swiss plums from the White Cross Orchard in Te Teko Whakatane, where Arthur and Martha Schuler had their orchard, and now their son Peter and his wife Diz own the orchard. This year like all other years Othmar and Marlies Hebler from Taranaki organised the plums for Taranaki and offered to get the Wellingtonians some Zwetschgen, too. For the two clubs alone the order was over 1.2t.

We will have to get the story about the plums from Arthur Schuler himself in another issue of the Helvetia.

Marlies Hebler shares her recipe:

Zwetschgenwähe

For an oven roasting dish

- 150g flour
- 1 tsp salt
- 150g cold butter, mix all into a dough, add
- 8 Tbs cold water, mix gently but fast, cover and let it stand for around 30 minutes.

Roll out the dough, line an oven dish, poke little holes into the pastry with a fork, then thinly sprinkle grated almonds or hazelnuts on the pastry and lay the halved plums into dish.

Pour custard mixture over the plums and bake in the bottom half of the oven at 180° - 220° C for 20-30 minutes.

Custard mixture:

- 600 ml milk or ½ milk ½ cream
- 2 eggs
- 2 Tbs custard powder
- 1 Tbs cornflour
- add sugar to your liking.
