




June 12 & 19: Jassen / Euchre 1.15pm. Come and enjoy a game of cards on a winter afternoon. It's a good time to catch up with friends.

We learnt about the sense of hearing, the various parts and their function in our ears, what can go wrong – and how we can minimize the frustrations that come with hearing loss. Hearing aids have become much more sophisticated; experiences shared varied greatly.

We had a good afternoon, and I hope the hints will be helpful and make understanding a bit easier. tb
