Giant water bugs are a delicacy in Thailand - either deep-fried or made into a sauce for dipping. Giant water bugs are sold by the kilo in open-air markets in many parts of the world.



## Baby banana pancakes

### Ingredients:

- 2 bananas, cut into disks
- 1/4 cup wholemeal self-raising flour (for dusting)
- 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour
- 1 tbsp sugar
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup milk
- 50g butter, melted



### Method:

- Dust the bananas in the 1/4 cup of flour to coat.
- In a bowl, mix the batter by combining the 1 cup of flour with the egg and milk and sugar and whisking vigorously.
- Heat a frying pan and melt a little butter in it.
- Dip the banana disks in the batter and fry on each side until golden.
