


a great crowd turning up at the Paradice Ice Rink in Avondale. Everybody liked to move on the unfamiliar surface although un-



The CatWalk Trust

In the last Helvetia we mentioned to keep the Sunday 20th of November free for a special event. Now we can reveal what this is all about.

In New Zealand alone, we have one new Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) every five days resulting in long lasting impairment. Whilst there are a number of organisations providing valuable rehabilitative support to those with SCI; The CatWalk Trust aims to challenge the current boundaries of research, enabling those suffering from a SCI to walk again.

CatWalk's Patrons include some of New Zealand's most famous stars: Richie McCaw, Sir Brian Lochore, Mark Todd and Dion Nash among others as well as the queen's granddaughter Zara Phillips (who was visiting New Zealand during the Rugby World Cup).

New Zealand's first Spinal Cord Injury Research Unit, dedicated to gaining a better understanding of the causes of disability following injury and to developing new treatments towards a cure, was launched at The University of Auckland in August this year. The research unit is based in the University's Centre for Brain Research and was established through a generous half million-dollar donation by the CatWalk Spinal Cord Injury Trust!

CatWalk was founded in 2005 by Catriona Williams, formerly one of New Zealand's leading international equestrian riders; she is now confined to a wheelchair following a riding accident in 2002. Catriona is an amazing woman who completed the New York marathon last year with her handcycle in just over 4 hours!

As part of their fundraising, CatWalk puts together a team of volunteers to run the ING New York Marathon. These people sign up to train for and run 42 kilometres; paying their own way to New York and raising a minimum of \$5000 each for Cat-Walk all wrapped up in one Marathon effort! This year the NZ team consists of 20 members, and Pia is one of them! She will be running the New York Marathon on the 6th of November even though she has never run a Marathon before. So far the Blaser family has raised over \$3000 and in order to reach the fundraising target of \$5000 they are organising this evening with the help of the Swiss Kiwi Yodlers and Alphorn players. So get on board and treat yourself to a great evening.

If you can't make the 20th you can donate towards the cause at Pia's fundraising account (all money goes directly to CatWalk and is tax deducti-
