January

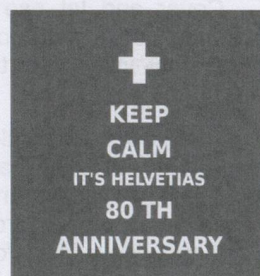
23 This is the last day to be able to order sausages for pick-up before the picnic. Ring Marianne on 7628757 or Lisette on 7628718 immediately!!!

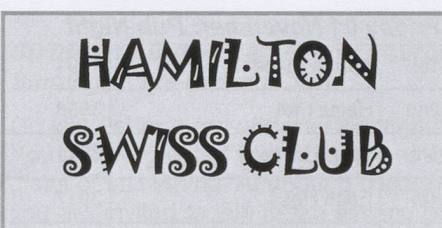
