

AMI Round the Bays & Picnic – 23 February


Some of our members have already registered for the 10K and halfmarathon and have started training seriously. It is open to walkers and runners and has three course options: 7K, 10K and half-marathon.

Unfortunately, there will be no jass in April as it clashes with our AGM. However, Trudi might be able to arrange an alternative date, so have a chat with her if you are interested.


AGM - 6 April
