

### Some fun things to do with kids over winter

Are you worried about what to do with the kids once the cold weather sets in which will not empty your wallet?

#### 1. Go on a welly walk

Ages 2-10. Great for wet weather. There are few things kids enjoy more than being allowed to jump in puddles and get wet. So ignore the weather, pull on your old clothes and boots and get outside and do some puddle-jumping.

#### 2. Put on a play

Ages 4 and up. Great for the show offs in the family. Choose one of their favourite books or stories and get them to act it out as a play. The whole family can take part! If you're feeling particularly creative you can get really stuck in and make costumes from old clothes. Classics like Little Red Riding Hood and Cinderella are great as the kids will know the stories so well already.

#### 3. Host a slumber party



Ages 6-12. Help them bond with their friends. Although children are very good at entertaining themselves it's a good idea to have some games to help structure the evening. Try "Who's in the bag?" Choose one person to leave the room and get everyone to zip themselves up in someone else's sleeping bag. The guesser then has to try and figure out who's who by asking questions - make sure all the children remember to try and disguise their voices.
