Zurich's Limmat River is the scene of this winter charity fundraiser in which several hundred people dressed only in swimming costumes and Santa hats attempt to swim a 111m-course from one bank to the other in distinctly nippy water, some compounding the chill by attempting to eat an ice lolly along the way. Their prize? A cup of Knorr soup and that warm fuzzy feeling that comes from helping a charity... and getting chilblains. Organised by the City of Zurich, there are scuba divers on hand to help out struggling swimmers, while participants' belongings are ferried across the river by support boats. Snow Waterslide Contest

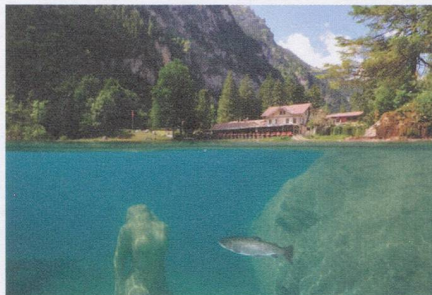

Fishing at Blausee – Mountain Spring Waters, Rainbow- and Salmon Trout

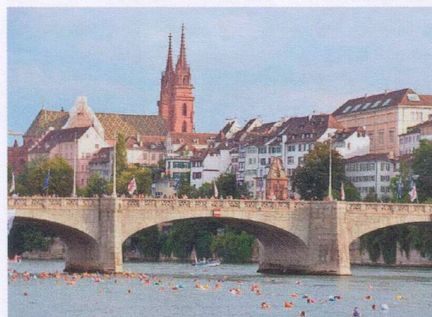

Basel Rhine Swim



The Basel Rhine Swim is a public sport event in the City of Basel, Switzerland. Accompanied by watercraft and lifeguards, participants swim or drift about 15 minutes down the Rhine from the Münster ferry on the Kleinbasel bank to the lower Rheinweg. The distance is about 1.8 kilometers. The Basel Rhine Swim has taken place every year from 1980, always on the first Tuesday after the school holidays. It is organised by the Swiss Life-Saving Society (SLRG)

Section Basel. Start is at 18.00 by the Münsterfähre on the Kleinbasel bank of the Rhine. The Rhine is closed for vessel traffic during the event. The number of participants ranges from several hundred to several thousand swimmers. In the summer of 2003, around 5,000 people took part. In 2007, the Basel Rhine Swim had to be cancelled due to flooding for the first time.
