Swiss Sporting Legends come together in Auckland

This summer has seen the arrival of a few great Swiss sporting legends in Auckland. The Saturday morning regulars at the Swiss Bakery in Milford have had the opportunity to meet and speak with them which has been a great pleasure and very interesting.

The sporting legends in question were no other than Jean-Pierre Egger who currently trains New Zealand's shotput legend Valerie Adams, and Edy Hubacher of great Swiss sporting fame. They are great friends going back a long time. Surprisingly, both also know the Auckland Swiss Club's Emil Tellenbach from a time when they were all young men and actively competing as members of the Swiss National Team in Athletics. What a wonderful opportunity for these sportsmen to catch up with each other on the other side of the world, and exchange memories and experiences.

Emil has taken the time to put some information together about Jean-Pierre and Edy, for which we are grateful.

Jean-Pierre Egger is currently the coach of New Zealand's Valerie Adams, well-known Olympic Champion and World Champion in women's shotput. Jean-Pierre himself was Swiss Champion in shot-put and an Olympian athlete representing Switzerland in the 1976 Montreal and 1980 Moscow Olympic Games, with a best result of 20.25 m. Following his active sporting career, he became a sporting coach. In this role, he coached the Swiss Alinghi sailing team for the America's Cup and

also Swiss shot-putter Werner Günthör, who became four times World Champion and once European Champion in shot-put, with a best of 22.75 m. Jean-Pierre operates his business "way to excellence" and is actively involved in coaching, training and teaching in sports and business.

Edy Hubacher has been a hugely versatile sportsman in Switzerland, winning Swiss championships in shotput, discus, pentathlon, decathlon and bobsleigh no less than 18 times!!! In 1968, Edy represented Switzerland in shot-put at the Olympic Games in Mexico. He followed this up with great success at the Winter Olympic Games in Sapporo in Japan, winning the Gold Medal with the four-man bobsleigh team and the Bronze Medal with the two-man Bobsleigh team. Later, he became bobsleigh coach at the winter Olympic Games in Innsbruck in 1976, and for many years represented the Swiss National Team in Athletics. Edy is a professional teacher and remains active to this day both physically and mentally now designing cross-word puzzles for Swiss magazines and newspapers.
