Children's Corner: Make your own Mother's Day Card

In New Zealand and Switzerland, Mother's Day is always on the second Sunday in May.

This is the day is when you can really show your Mum how special she is. So why not make her a card and tell her why you love her. Be creative. Try and make your card as special as you can. You could use coloured paper/artboard, felt pens, paint, crayons or cut out pictures. There is no one way or right way to make a card. You older kids might make a double-sided one by folding the paper in half. Have a look at the example shown below and then make your own one:

Page 1 becomes the title page

Page 2 is usually left blank

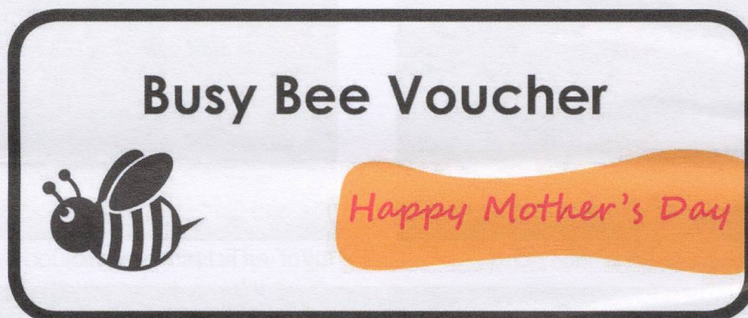
Page 3 should contain your message and read like a short letter, starting with "Dear Mum ..."

Page 4 may be left blank or you might add something else, perhaps even write a wee poem!

Inside the card you may slip in a Busy Bee Voucher or two. This is a promise from you to your Mum to help her with something. You decide what you will do. For example: do the dishes for a week without moaning, help in the garden for one hour or clean the bathroom. Think about what your mum would like.
