

The year has rolled around ever so quickly, and on the 13th of May, 34 avid card players met once again at the United Parish Church in Cambridge for yet another series of Card Evenings. After briefly meeting and greeting one another, seating numbers were distributed and serious competition was soon underway....

The total scores from the first three rounds of the regular card competition were used to count towards the Society Medal Jass for the 21 players who this year chose to participate in this event.

At the end of the evening, Anna Blattler was our first winner with a total of 4193 points. At the other end of the score list, Elisabeth Gaemperle was awarded the booby prize with 3370 points.

The second card evening, on 27th

May, was attended by 36 players - the first place went to Robert Frischknecht with a very impressive 4367 points, whilst Margaret Hayward received a packet of pasta as a booby prize for scoring 3253 points!

Two weeks later, we again had 36 card players at the third evening on 6th June, where Heinz Leuenberger was awarded the first prize, scoring 4210 points. This time, Lina Rufer was the 'lucky winner' of the booby prize with 3266 points.

Next, at our fourth card evening on 24th June, we had 38 players vying for a prize, with the first place eventually going to Robert Frischknecht for a second time, this time with a score 4244 points. At the other end of the scale, Karl Waldvogel earned a chocolate bar as a booby prize with only 3081 points!

On the 1st and 4th evenings, we were faced with player numbers not divisible by four (38 and 34), and for the first time this year, we trialled one card table with six players, instead of the usual 'table of two', which most people disliked immensely! It seems that this change has worked well and has been seen a welcome improvement to the status quo! It was great to see many of our regular card players came along again this year, but it was also encouraging to see several new faces - particularly those of the 'younger generation'.
