## Globi - the popular swiss cartoon character

A big yellow beak, a pair of red and black checkered trousers, a black beret on his head – this is Globi. A humorous and cheerful rascal with a big heart. The smart inventor finds a solution for every problem (even though it doesn't always turn out well). Globi is inventive and imaginative, helpful and authentic, but he is also temperamental and can get angry sometimes. Through his curiosity, he experiences repeatedly new adventures, travels to unusual places and meets interesting people and animals.

Globi was created by the Swiss cartoonist Robert Lips, as an advertising character for the Swiss department store Globus in 1932 for the company's 25th anniversary.

Since the first picture book in 1935 "Globis Weltreise", every year a new volume was produced, some of them are available in English. Globi books have been sold over 9 million times until today.
