
What are the names of your local cinemas?... yes really!!!

I wish you all well for the next few months and hope that unlike me you survive the winter months without being laid low with the sniffles.

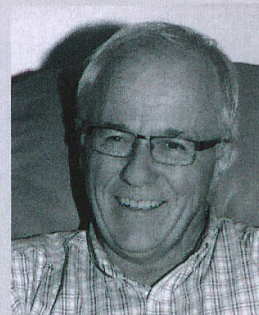

I would like to pick up on a couple of topics arising from the meeting because I feel they are of great importance to us all and we really do need your input and opinion on them.

ONE: your committee has been working at overhauling the Society Constitution and Sports Rules but we failed to realise just how much work this created for us and the clubs. In the end there was no, or late, feedback from the clubs and we made the decision to postpone adoption of any amendments to the Constitution and Sports Rules. We did pass a resolution to attend to this over the coming months with the intention of having an agreed revised version ready for presentation at the next AGM.

Two: We discussed the progress made on issues such as AHV, AIA and other topics that were discussed with various sources back in Switzerland. All this correspondence went either through our Embassy or our CSA Oceania representatives. Our representatives are Peter Ehrler and Peter Canziani.
