Obituaries

Martha Wüthrich

17 August 1924 – 22 December 2018

Martha was born in Belp in the Bern-Mittelland, about 20 minutes from Switzerland's capital city of Bern. She grew up on a farm with her two sisters Trudi and Hanni (who both predeceased her). After finishing her schooling, her dream was to become a nurse but her father had other ideas and wanted his Martha to help on the family farm. Martha obliged and continued to help her father until she was about 30, when her father gave up farming allowing Martha the opportunity to commence her studies to become a nurse. At 35 she realised her dream and became a District Nurse in the Bern area for thirteen years until she had to give up her nursing career due to ongoing back problems.

In 1972 she met up with a childhood friend Hans (Hausi) Wuthrich who lived in New Zealand but was in Switzerland on holiday. A romance blossomed and in February 1973 Martha flew to New Zealand to be with her sweetheart. Only a few days after her arrival, the Taranaki Swiss Clubs' picnic was being held at Te Ngutu Park and Hausi proudly presented Martha to his many Swiss friends (who had all doubted him that his Swiss girlfriend was coming out!!!). Soon after they married and enjoyed a wonderful sixteen years together. Unfortunately during this time Hausi had become sick and Martha's gentle nursing skills were required again as she looked after him.

Martha joined the Taranaki Swiss Club upon her arrival, and participated in the Trachtengruppe in her Berner Gotthelftracht and also sang in the little singing group at the time. Both Hausi and Martha enjoyed playing Jass, participating in the Swiss Society competitions. Later they were unable to attend club functions due to ill-health, but continued their membership and were interested in the clubs' activities. They were always very grateful and appreciative to all their Swiss friends who regularly visited them.

Members of the Taranaki Swiss Club and the Swiss Society extend their sincere sympathy to Martha's family in Switzerland and her friends in New Zealand.

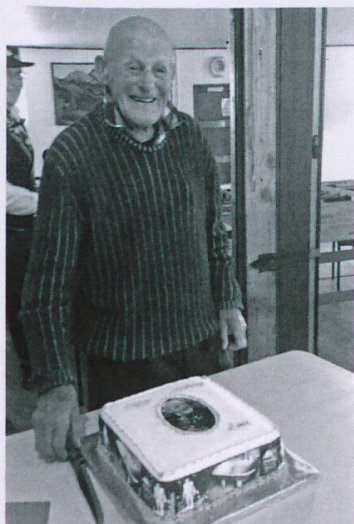
