Obituaries



Marc Schleiniger

1964 - 2018

Marc was a much-loved member of Wellington Swiss Club, and during his time as a member, including on the committee as Treasurer, he made a lasting impact. The electronic cashbook we use today for book-keeping was his creation, and the new family events the Club now organises, largely his instigation. His presence was felt by all who came near him, whether it was decorating the Christmas tree at Samichlaus, waterblasting the clubhouse at the working bee, washing dishes and cleaning up, or chatting over a glass of wine at the end of an evening meal at the clubhouse.

Born in Zürich and raised by his parents, Rose-marie and Jürg, in Hombrechtikon, in the canton of Zürich, Marc was the oldest of two brothers, Remy and Guy, and one sister, the youngest, Babette. The boys helped to build the family home, a two-story, standalone house in a section with a beautiful garden and trees. The family were close and they often travelled together.

Marc was always talkative; he was used to walk home every day from school, and was always late home, talking to his friend Peter.
