**GECOM 91: Generic Concepts in Mycology**

September 3-5, 1991, Lausanne University

In 1976 an International Symposium held at the University of Lausanne attempted to discuss the "Species Concept in Hymenomycetes". You may remember this event, or you may have read about it in the report published by Cramer.

At that occasion the idea had been put forward to organize a similar symposium covering the generic concepts in the same fungal group. During preliminary preparations for such a symposium it became more and more evident that the scope of the symposium should be changed to include other fungal groups as well.

**FIDEC 93: Fruitbody Induction and Development in Experimental Culture**

August or September 1993, Lausanne, Bern or Zürich

Culture work has been important in many fields of mycology ever since it has been possible to grow fungi in the laboratory. Detailed knowledge of fruit body induction and development has become even more desirable for the commercial production of fungi for food and becomes increasingly important for genetical, physiological and taxonomical analyses.

The Swiss Mycological Society plans to organize an international symposium covering this topic in 1993. Exact dates and the site have not yet been determined.

**PHYRAM 95: Phylogenetic Reconstruction Analyses in Mycology**

August or September 1995, Lausanne, Bern or Zürich

With the increasing power of modern computers and all the theoretical work on phylogenetic analyses that is carried out these years, it becomes more and more feasible to base taxonomy on reasonably realistic models of fungal phylogeny. Until today only very few phylogenetic or cladistic analyses of fungal groups have been published, but during the next few years our possibilities to do significant research in this field will increase greatly. So, until 1995 we should be able to present meaningful discussions of realistic cladistic and phylogenetic analyses and to apply these ideas to taxonomy.

The Swiss Mycological Society plans to organize an international symposium covering this topic in 1995. Exact dates and the site have not yet been determined.

All Special Lectures must be submitted to the organisators who will decide on its suitability for presentation. After acceptation, extensive summaries of the Special Lectures will be photocopied and sent to all registered participants. After each presentation of a Special Lecture ample time will be given for discussion. The discussions will be taped for later editing and published together with the text of the Special Lectures.

**Afternoon discussions** extend topics presented or discussed during the Special Lecture Sessions, or entirely new topics may be brought up, if there is some good connection with the general theme of the symposium. These discussions will be taped for later editing and publication together with the Special Lectures.

**Afternoon Oral Presentations** are limited to 15-20 minutes and may cover any subject related to the general topic of GECOM 91. Every participant of the symposium may use this possibility. Summaries will be sent to every participant before the symposium. They too will be published in the final report about the symposium.

An exhibition of **Posters** is planned in the entrance hall of the Biology Building. Summaries of the posters will be published in the final report about the symposium.

**Information for authors of a Special Lecture.**

Based on our experience with the 1976 symposium on the species concept, we would like to come up with a few recommendations.

When writing up your Special Lecture, please keep the following guide lines in mind:

- 1) The paper must express your genus concept in a very direct way.
- 2) If possible, sum up your presentation with something like: "My genus concept is ...". Discussion will be around this statement, rather than around details from chapters of minor importance.
- 3) Do not present taxonomic papers of the usual type. If you use taxonomy as a means for expressing your genus concept, refrain from presenting descriptions of taxa: present mechanisms of recognition and delimitation of genera instead of descriptions.
- 4) If you use a multi-technique approach, please present the techniques in a very concise manner and then focus on their bearing on your genus concept, allowing ample time for *that* aspect of your lecture.
- 5) A "permanent summary" of your Special Lecture is a Poster. If ever possible, please do not neglect this way of expressing yourself.
- 6) If a manuscript does not present your genus concept in a very clear and explicit way, the organisers may ask you to review your style. If you do not present any discussable genus concept, you better refrain from presenting a Special Lecture. We would of course regret this.
- 7) Please keep the deadline of May 31st, 1991. This allows us to ask revision of your manuscript (if necessary), and then to photocopy the final text for distribution.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

### GENERAL INFORMATION

**Scope of the journal:** Ecology, experimental mycology, mycological genetics, medical mycology and mycotoxins, monographs, morphology, cytology, plectology, classical and computer assisted taxonomy, systematics, nomenclature. Priority is given to papers dealing with Basidiomycetes and Ascomycetes. Book reviews are welcome.

**Reviews:** Papers are submitted to one or two reviewers. Acceptance depends on the reviewers comments. Manuscripts must not be submitted to other journals at any time.

**Languages:** Contributions may be written in English, French, German or Italian.

**Abstracts** are required in two languages, preferably in English and in one of the other admitted languages. The abstracts should not exceed 500 words and are required for all papers exceeding 3 pages of text. Every abstract should be written in an informative style. Give essential details of techniques or research findings. Avoid generalizations and statements with low information content, like "... are reported", "... have been given", etc.

**Use of scientific names** must follow the latest edition of the International Code of Botanical Nomenclature. Do not cite authors in titles or in abstracts.

### PREPARATION OF MANUSCRIPTS

**Papers may be submitted either as a type written manuscript on paper, or as an electronic text file on a diskette.** The manuscripts will be formatted by our staff according to the current standard of *Mycologia Helvetica*, using a desk top publishing programme on a personal computer. Typed manuscripts will be scanned electronically for input prior to formatting. Since all manuscripts will be formatted electronically, a few special instructions are in order: Do not underline; italics and bold face letters may be used; use tabulations instead of spaces for the preparation of columns in tables. All type written manuscripts submitted on paper must be neatly typed (without any corrections), contain clearly separated paragraphs and doublespaced lines in order to permit flawless scanning. Computer printouts using dot matrix letters are allowed.

Text files on diskettes may use any of the following formats: Acta 3.0; ASCII text only; AppleWorks; Microsoft Word 3.0, 4.0 Macintosh; Microsoft Word PC 4.0, 5.0; Microsoft Word Perfect 1.0 Macintosh; Microsoft Word Perfect PC 4.2, 5.0; Microsoft Works 1.1; Microsoft Write 1.0; Write Now 1.0, 2.0. Electronic picture files on diskettes may use PICT or EPSF format. Use standard density Macintosh or PC diskettes, avoid high density format.

**The title** should be followed by the name(s) and address(es) of the author(s).

**Figures and tables** must be accompanied by an explanatory legend.

**Illustrations** must fit within a rectangle of 148 x 220 mm or of 177 x 263 mm. They may be original line drawings (indian ink) or high contrast black and white photographs on glossy paper. Use of scale markers is required for all the illustrations. All figures should be numbered individually. Do not combine photographs and drawings on the same plate. Acceptance of coloured illustrations (photographs or original paintings) depends on financial possibilities.

**References** are alphabetic. They are cited in the text with authors name and year of publication such as: (Moser 1983); Jülich (1984) showed...

**Citations** in the list of referees should be as follows:

**Page and editorial charges:** The authors will not be billed for publication except when the text is not of sufficient quality for scanning and must be rewritten. Separate charges will be made for coloured illustrations depending on the actual printing costs. If an author does not have the resources to meet the charges he should write to the editor. Acceptance of the manuscript does not depend on the payment of the charges.

**Reprints** must be ordered when submitting the paper. Authors will receive 50 reprints free of charge but will be billed for additional copies according to actual printing costs.

### GÉNÉRALITÉS

**Thèmes de la revue:** Ecologie, mycologie expérimentale, génétique mycologique, mycologie médicale, toxicologie, monographies, morphologie, cytologie, plectologie, taxonomie classique ou numérique, systématique et nomenclature. Priorité sera donnée aux travaux portant sur les Ascomycètes et les Basidiomycètes. Les critiques d'ouvrages sont bienvenues. Expertises: L'acceptation d'un article dépend de l'avis d'un ou de plusieurs experts à qui le travail est soumis pour appréciation. L'article ne doit pas être proposé ailleurs en même temps pour une publication.

**Langues:** MYCOLOGIA HELVETICA publie des travaux dans les langues suivantes: français, allemand, italien ou anglais.

**Résumés:** ils doivent être rédigés en deux langues au moins, dont l'anglais. Un résumé, nécessaire dès que l'article dépasse 3 pages, doit comporter au maximum 500 mots. Il sera rédigé dans un style informatif et on y mentionnera les principales particularités de la méthode de travail et les résultats de recherche. On y évitera des généralités et des expressions futiles telles que: "On a examiné ...", "On a cherché ...", etc.

**Citations des noms scientifiques:** elle doit se conformer aux prescriptions de la dernière édition du Code International de Nomenclature Botanique. On ne citera pas les auteurs dans les titres ni dans les résumés.

### MANUSCRITS

**Les manuscrits peuvent nous parvenir soit sur papier et tapés à la machine, soit enregistrés électroniquement sur disquette.** Les collaborateurs de MYCOLOGIA HELVETICA formateront les textes sur ordinateur. Les textes sur papier sont lus optiquement puis formatés. En raison du traitement électronique, les instructions suivantes doivent être respectées: ne pas souligner du texte; caractères gras et italiques sont autorisés; lors de la confection de colonnes pour une table, utiliser uniquement le tabulateur et non la barre d'espacement. Pour les manuscrits sur papier, utiliser des caractères nets et propres (sans corrections: celles-ci perturbent la lecture optique), séparer clairement les paragraphes et utiliser un double interligne. Les caractères matriciels (lettres

composées de points) sont autorisés. Pour les textes sur disquette, nous acceptons les formats suivants: Acta 3.0; ASCII text only; AppleWorks; Microsoft Word 3.0, 4.0 Macintosh; Microsoft Word PC 4.0, 5.0; Microsoft Word Perfect PC 1.0 Macintosh; Microsoft Word Perfect PC 4.2, 5.0; Microsoft Works 1.1; Microsoft Write 1.0; Write Now 1.0, 2.0. Pour les dessins électroniques, n'utiliser que les formats PICT ou EPSF . Utiliser des disquettes Macintosh ou PC normales (non "high density").

Après **le titre** doivent figurer nom(s) et adresse(s) du (des) auteur(s).

Accompagner **les tables et les dessins** de légendes explicatives.

Toutes les **illustrations** doivent s'inscrire dans un rectangle de 148 x 220 ou de 177 x 263 mm. Pour les dessins au trait et pour les photos en noir-blanc, on peut utiliser du papier brillant. Sur tous les dessins figurera une échelle. Chaque dessin doit être numéroté individuellement. Ne pas disposer sur un même tableau des dessins et des photos. L'acceptation d'illustrations en couleurs dépend de nos capacités financières.
